

THE TEN COMMANDMENTS?

The Old Testament (Exodus 20:3-17)



- It was **ONLY** given to the nation of Israel (The Jews)
- It became an effective law to the Israelites only after the exodus from Egypt
- The Ten Commandments and the law were given through Moses
- The Ten Commandments were discontinued as a law about AD 33
- The Ten Commandments are **NO LONGER** in effect (Colossians 2:14)



“Behold, I have come to do Your will, O God.”

- 6. Do not murder**
Revelation 21:8; 1 John 3:15
- 7. Do not commit adultery**
1 Corinthians 6:9,10; Hebrews 13:4
- 8. Do not steal**
Ephesians 4:28; 1 Corinthians 6:9,10
- 9. Do not lie**
Ephesians 4:25; Colossians 3:9
- 10. Do not covet**
Colossians 3:5; 1 Corinthians 6:10
